Caving is a dangerous activity that can result in injury or death. Always:

- Acquire permission from the landowner
- Tell a responsible person where you're going
- Tell them when you will be out
- Have at least two people with you
- Wear a helmet
- Carry 3 light sources per person
- Take food and drink
- Ensure that the ceiling is solid rock (not cracked or loose debris)
- Learn how to be safe and conserve caves for the future by joining a local chapter of the National Speleological Society (www.caves.org)

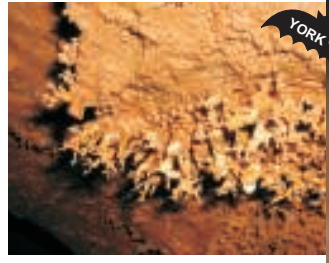
